FREYA'S RINGS

Freya was the Old Norse goddess of love and fertility and she was known to be very beautiful. Freya's rings is a different version of the ancient ring game of quoits but is played practically the same ways.

The game is made of beautifully finished mahogany wood and consists of 2 planks, 5 poles and 5 rings of rope.

Objective of The game of Freyas is a ring-throwing game, the game where you have to throw the 5 rope rings over the upright pins to gain different point scores. You can either play alone or two or more persons.

Preparation

You need to assemble the game first, which is quite easy and quick to do. You first find the 2 big planks in the box, which you assemble in the middle and in that way form a cross. Then you find the 5 poles, which you place upright on the tip of each plank and in the middle of the cross.

Now you decide a proper distance where you mark a line from which you will be throwing the enclosed rings made out of rope.

How to Play

You stand behind the marked line without stepping over it. You are allowed to lean forward when you throw your 5 rings and try to hit the 5 upright poles. Each pole means a different score and this game has the score-points 5, 10, 15 and 20 situated on each tip of the planks and 25 points in the middle of the cross.

You can throw the rings as many times as you decide and when every ring has been thrown, you calculate how many points you have got.
